- C. **Write a reflection paper,** responding to the literature you have read. This should be typed and at least 250 words.

Submit the attached scoring rubric, the character interview, story map, reflection paper, and reading logs to your homeroom teacher on *the first day of school for the 2020-2021 School Year.*
